# **FALL** third year

This is the ideal year for study abroad. The student should consult with a full-time professor in the major language on which courses to take while abroad (this consultation may continue while the student is abroad, depending on the program and its release schedule for the course catalogue). Students generally earn 12 to 16 credits abroad. Students who began their language studies in level one should take a full load of courses that apply toward the target language major.

The schedule below is for students studying abroad in the spring or during the fourth year, fall semester. Students should take a 4-credit hour 300-level course to stay on track for the major. Advanced Conversation is strongly recommended this semester for students studying abroad in the spring.

### **SPRING** third year

# **FALL** fourth year

 This is *not* the ideal semester for study abroad. However, some students (esp. Teacher Education students) may find it necessary to study abroad this semester. Students studying abroad this semester must work in consultation with a full-time faculty member in the major language to conduct research for the senior capstone while abroad. The student should consult with a full-time professor in the major language on which courses to take while abroad (this consultation may continue while the student is abroad, depending on the program and its release schedule for the course catalogue). Students who began their language studies in level one should take a full load of courses that apply toward the target language major.

The schedule below is for students who studied abroad during the third year. All language majors must complete the sequence for the capstone research project. The student should complete MLC 491 this semester. Although it is technically possible for a student to simultaneously enroll in MLC 491 & 492 next semester, this should only occur *if absolutely necessary*. Students have failed to complete MLC 491 satisfactorily; <u>waiting to enroll a student in MLC 491 in the spring puts the student's graduation schedule at serious risk.</u>

Teacher Education students who studied abroad the previous semester or year must take MLC 490 (Study Abroad Capstone Seminar). This seminar is recommended, but not required, of non-Teacher Education language majors. Teacher Education majors must also complete MLCX 340 (The French/German/Spanish-Speaking World) before graduation.
