

Advising Information for Those Interested in Teacher Education

Students who would like to graduate with the ability to get a Teaching Certificate should speak with a member of the Teacher Education Department during their first year at Adrian College.

If you are advising students interested in Teacher Education, the following guidelines will help for their first 3 semesters.

Freshman Year

CORE101/CORE102 and Distributions/Proficiencies courses should be taken.

TED101 Explorations in Education (1 credit)

TED299c Intro to Instructional Technology (1 credit)

Sophomore Year

Distributions/Proficiencies courses should be taken.

TED204 Educational Psychology (3credits) along with a Field Experience (1 credit) TED200,201 or 202

TED205 Exceptional Students (3credits) with Co-req TED203 Field Experience (1credit)

TED206 Child Development (3 credits) with Co-req TED211(1credit) (for Elementary certificates)

TED217 Adolescent Development (3 credits) along with a

Field Experience (1credit) TED201 or 202 (for Secondary and K-12 certificates)

Students should meet with a Teacher Education professor and Teacher Education Certification Officer during Freshman year and *must* meet with the Teacher Certification Officer Sophomore Year.
